Curriculum

The leadership institute program is carefully crafted with two specific yet interrelated topics. The first is leadership and professional growth. Participants will examine key concepts related to leadership and will practice implementation through selfreflection and activity-based exercises. Second, the program will examine the role we play as citizens of our community in key topics such as economic development, government, quality of life, and others. Guest speakers take participants on a journey of these issues by providing critical information for today, as well as how we can be a part of the solution for change in the future.
